



Yummy Ribbed Beanie

This is a yummy, chunky-ribbed beanie. With deeply textural columns of fisherman's rib, this beanie is alluring and fun to make. A satisfying quick knit and a perfect luxury gift. You're going to love it!

Skill Level

Intermediate or Adventurous Beginner – appropriate for intermediate knitters who know how to (or can learn how to) cast-on, knit, purl, slip/pssso decrease and bind off.

Sizing

Sizes: One Size Fits Most Adults

Finished Measurements

Finished hat circumference unstretched: Approximately 19 in (48) cm
Note: This hat stretches considerably and is designed to fit very loosely

Yarn

A Chick That Knitz: 100% Merino Bulky, 109 yds/skein

Colourways shown: Dijon Mustard or Sooner (Color A) and Robin's Egg or Boomer (Color B)

Yarn requirements: 1 skein each of two contrasting colors of choice

Needles

Suggested needles: 16" circular needle, US 10.5 and 10.75 (6.5mm and 7mm)
40" magic-loop needle, or double-pointed needles
size US 10.75 (7mm)



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Gauge

Gauge: ~10.5 per 4 inches(10cm) in stockinette stitch

Notions

Blunt Tip Needle

Stitch Marker to denote the beginning of round and 3 additional stitch markers of a different color

Big Fur Ball with snap for fastening

Notes

Construction Overview

This hat is worked from the bottom-up in fisherman's rib. Body is worked to the required length and the top is shaped in rib pattern with a series of slip stitches and pass-over decreases. The hat is finished by gathering up the remaining stitches to secure and attaching a big fluffy pompom.

Special Techniques / Tutorials

k = knit one stitch

p = purl one stitch

pssso = pass slip stitches over

pm/sm = place marker/slip marker

k1b = Knit one stitch below - Insert right needle tip into the stitch below the next stitch on the left needle and knit it

p1b = Purl one stitch below - Insert left needle tip from the back into the stitch below the next stitch on the left needle and purl it.

Directions

Work Brim

With smaller needle and Color A, cast on 48 stitches using the long-tail method or your preferred method.

Place marker for beginning of round and join stitches in the round being careful not to twist.

Round 1: (k1, p1) repeat to end of round.

Round 2: (k1, p1) repeat to end of round.

Round 3: (k1b, p1) repeat to end of round.

Round 4: (k1, p1b) repeat to end of round

Repeat rounds 3 and 4 2 more times

Then repeat round 3 one more time



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Work Body of Hat and add in Color 2

Switch to larger needle.

Round 1 (Color B): (k1, p1b) repeat to end of round

Round 2 (Color A): (k1b, p1) repeat to end of round

Repeat rounds 1 and 2 13 more times (26 rounds), switching colors every round

Continue Body with Color B only

Cut Color A leaving a 10" tail

With Color B only:

Repeat Rounds 1 and 2 above 8 more times (16 rounds).

Begin Decreases for Top of Hat

Note: Switch to double-pointed needles or magic loop as necessary

Dec Round 1: *k1, slip next 2 sts together knitwise, p1b, pss0; (k1, p1b) 4 times, pm -- repeat from * to end of round. (40 sts)

Round 2: *k1b, k1, (k1b, p1) 4 times, sm - repeat from * to end of round.

Dec Round 3: *k1, k1b, k1; wyib slip next 2 sts together knitwise, p1b, pss0; (k1, p1b) 2 times, sm -- repeat from * to end of round. (32 sts)

Round 4: *(k1b, k1) 2 times, (k1b, p1) 2 times, sm -- repeat from * to end of round.

Dec Round 5: *wyib slip next 2 sts together knitwise, k1, pss0, k1b, k1; wyib slip next 2 sts together knitwise, p1b, pss0, sm -- repeat from * to end of round. (16 sts)

Round 6: *k1, wyib slip next 2 sts together knitwise, k1, pss0, sm -- repeat from * to end of round. (8sts)

Finishing

Cut yarn leaving a 10" tail

Thread a blunt-tip needle with the tail and gather up the remaining 8 stitches to secure the top of the hat.

Stabilize Brim if desired

Optional: Work a round of crochet slip stitches around the bottom of the brim to stabilize the beanie and keep it from stretching too much.

Weave in all ends and sew on the base portion of the pompom snap.

Snap on pompom!
